Waste Pro Co-Heart program allows current employees the opportunity to acquire their CDL. Training assistance is provided to aid employees in obtaining their learner's permit, with the goal of testing for their CDL.

Created in 2015, the program has successfully assisted more than 100 team members in obtaining their CDL. Candidates are required to pay for the initial cost of the testing fee, but are reimbursed after one year of accident, injury, and damage free service.
